Sermon Notes: Joshua 24 & 25 As For Me And My House... Rob Classen

In his 110 years, Joshua experienced—slavery in Egypt, the plagues, the Exodus, serving as Moses' aide, one of the 12 spies, becoming Moses' successor, leading the Israelites through the desert, crossing the Jordan River, and commanding the army in their conquest of the Promised Land.

As his life draws to an end, Joshua gives his farewell address.

HOME GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- ICEBREAKER—
- Read **Joshua 23:1-8**—How do you think Joshua felt as he looked back on his life? What does he reminds the leaders about in vs. 3-5? What were the positive things they were to do? What were the negative things they weren't supposed to do?
- Read **Joshua 23:14-16**. How would these verses help the leaders understand God better? Why is it important that we understand both sides of the covenant—the good and the bad?
- Read **Joshua 24:14-16**. Tell the group of a time in the past when God was faithful to you. After all the Israelites had been through, why were they given a choice about whom to serve?
- What is the biggest "take-away" from studying the book of Joshua?
